Brown, which is intended to help advance the Western New York region by providing support for innovative and inclusive talent attraction efforts; sparking dynamic public and private sector approaches to infrastructure improvements; and fostering the creation of attractive urban spaces and environments—both indoors and out.

BUILDING ON OUR SUCCESS

Following the positive strides made through the Buffalo Building Reuse Program and other complementary studies and efforts, the focus of *Buffalo's Race for Place* is initially to make the City of Buffalo's downtown core and other key urban areas more vibrant, walkable, and connected. Through the improvement and maintenance of public infrastructure and the integration of "smart city" technology, the City of Buffalo seeks to continually evolve as an attractive home for businesses, entrepreneurs, new talent, and the existing workforce of local residents alike.
